- Assist Veterans in transitioning from military to civilian life and higher education
- Liaison to on-campus resources and other VA benefits and services
- To encourage, promote, and support Veterans to be successful in their educational programs and career endeavors
- Provide Chapter 36 Counseling to eligible individuals
- Perform Chapter 31VRE Case Management for campus specific CH 31 participants



- First started in 2009 at Cleveland State University and University of South Florida
- 2010 program expanded to include 8 pilot VSOC locations
- Arizona State University was one of original 8 pilot locations
- Full time on campus at ASU beginning Spring 2011
- 104 current campus locations

Benefits of a VSOC Counselor



- Direct VA contact for students on their time
- Knowledge of both school processes and VA processes to help review
- complex issues
- Clarification on how VA benefits work and best options
- Support School Certifying Officials
- Individual with counseling background that can apply skills to student issues and concerns
- Support strong connection to local VA offices
- Provide training and information on VA benefits to school staff and faculty
- Each VSOC location is unique in certain ways that best fit the needs of their campus

- **District School** the traditional style of public school. Each district covers a geographic region of the state and typically oversees multiple schools.
- Charter Schools public, state-funded schools that operate under a charter contract with a charter school sponsor or authorizer.
- **Open Enrollment** A family may seek to enroll their child in another public, district school by completing an enrollment application during open enrollment period (typically in January).

The Arizona Online Instruction (AOI) Program established in A.R.S. §15-808 allows approved school districts and charter schools to develop online instructional systems to expand learning opportunities for students throughout our state.

The State Board of Education approves district AOI programs. https://azsbe.az.gov/resources/arizona-online-instruction



- Refers to a learning environment where a small group of children (typically less than 10) meet in a home and are lead by a teacher known as a "guide".
- Arizona has one main microschool option right now. Prenda Schools is a K-8 model and has microschools across Arizona with over 1,000 enrolled.
- Tuition-free and private pay options are available.

- Homeschoolers are children whose parents or legal guardians choose to educate them at home in at least the required subjects of reading, grammar, math, science, and social studies.
- Homeschool families file an affidavit with the state of their intention to homeschool, but aren't required to turn in lesson plans or take state tests.

- Arizona private schools are tuition based and operate independently. There are a variety of private school options for Arizona families to choose from.
- Tuition assistance is available!



- Arizona taxpayers can receive a dollar-for-dollar credit on their state taxes when they give to a School Tuition Organization (STO).
- Arizona STOs provide families scholarships that can be used at the private school that best meets their child's needs.
- A parent applies for their student through an STO. If a scholarship is available, the STO sends a check directly to the private school.

- The ESA Program began in 2011 and is administered by the Arizona Department of Education and the Arizona State Board of Education.
- Parents who choose an ESA are able to access their child's state education dollars. These funds can be used for private school tuition, home education, tutors and more.
- The ESA Program allows families to customize an education that meets the needs of their child.

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
