2011 - 2013

Took the suicide rate within the Arizona National Guard from highest ever for 3 years to zero suicides for the 3 years of program operation. **2017 – Present** 

Responsive program created after suicide rate for Arizona veterans was 3-4x higher than general population during an 18-month period. Focus is all service members, veterans & their families. Funded by state, VA and other partners.

2020 - 2022 +

Development and implementation of a data tool and risk reduction strategy with CDC to focus on proactive engagement of those at highest risk.



### **Proactive**


Use data and community input to identify vulnerable populations... and proactively engage those at higher risk.

# **Upstream Prevention**

(many talk about it...in AZ we're doing it!)

GREEN ZONE: Ready

No crisis and stress is manageable

YELLOW ZONE: Stress Reaction

Increased signs of distress

ORANGE ZONE:

Stress Injury

Urgent situation requiring support

**RED ZONE:** 

Stress Illness

Immediate danger or threat to life

Goal = earlier intervention to positively impact social determinants of health

Identify high risk segments through combining data, analysis and mapping

# **Risk Reduction Strategy**







Proactively outreach, engage and serve veterans and families within that segment Focus on improving short and intermediate outcomes tied to reducing suicide risk

approaches and projects based on outcomes

How do we know if the risk reduction strategy is an effective way to reduce suicide risk within Arizona's veteran population?

# **Risk Reduction Framework**



Identify outcome
measures for the short
& intermediate
outcomes



Implement a series of projects focused on improving short & intermediate outcomes with segments of the veteran population at higher risk



Conduct evaluation on the individual projects and the risk reduction strategy as a whole

# **Example Projects Past & Future**



Transportation support program to remove barriers



Addressing food insecurity as an initial connection point to address social determinants of health



ADVS VBC proactive referral process to engage veterans with a known or potential disability



coaching to reduce social isolation (VA Fox Grant)






# **Prevention Scenario - Yellow Zone (Emory & Connie)**

Scenario: Emory doesn't seem himself during a virtual meeting. Connie calls him to see if everything is okay. Emory states he received news that a friend and fellow airman died by suicide over the weekend.

# Prevention ~ Yellow Zone



### **Supports:**

- Psychology/Therapies: individual/couples/family
- Groups: grief and loss, peer support groups (e.g., Vet Centers, TAPS, AFSP, Alliance of Hope)
- Psychiatry: medication, ketamine infusion therapy, TMS stimulation, ECT
- Social Support: family, friends, neighbors, battle buddies
  - Be Connected Connection Coaches (SSG Fox SPGP)




# Intervention Scenario - Orange Zone (Emory & Connie ~ with Nicki/Joel as a Crisis Team)

Scenario: In addition to prior information, Emory is not taking meds/self medicating with alcohol; went to a gun show, bought new firearms, going to the range more, etc.

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# Intervention ~ Orange Zone



### **Supports:**

- Psychology/Therapies: Individual/couples/family
- Groups: mental health counseling or substance abuse counseling/support groups e.g. depression, anxiety, grief and loss, peer support groups, e.g. NA/AA
- Psychiatry: medication, Ketamine infusion therapy, TMS Stimulation, ECT
- Hospitals: in-patient short-term/long-term/residential programs
- Means Safety: Firearm Locks/Safe, Dispose of or turn in unused meds, sharps restriction/toxic chemicals, household toxic items
- Case management



# Postvention Scenario - Red Zone (Emory & Martin/Oscar)

Scenario: Lost a friend to suicide, goes to hospital after crisis intervention and team's recommendation due to having own suicidal thoughts. Martin is the social worker, Oscar is a Peer Support Specialist at the VA, both are offering discharge options.

# Postvention ~ Red Zone




### **Supports:**

- Psychology/Therapies: Individual/couples/family
- Groups: mental health counseling, substance abuse counseling, support groups for depression, anxiety, grief and loss (e.g., NA/AA, Postvention Alliance)
- Psychiatry: medication, Ketamine infusion therapy, TMS Stimulation, ECT
- Means Restriction: Give firearms to a family member/friend, medication restricted to one week supply, alcohol removed from home or locked up
- Intensive case management and connections
  - Be Connected High Acuity Care Transition Team (SSG Fox SPGP)
  - VA Peer Support
